

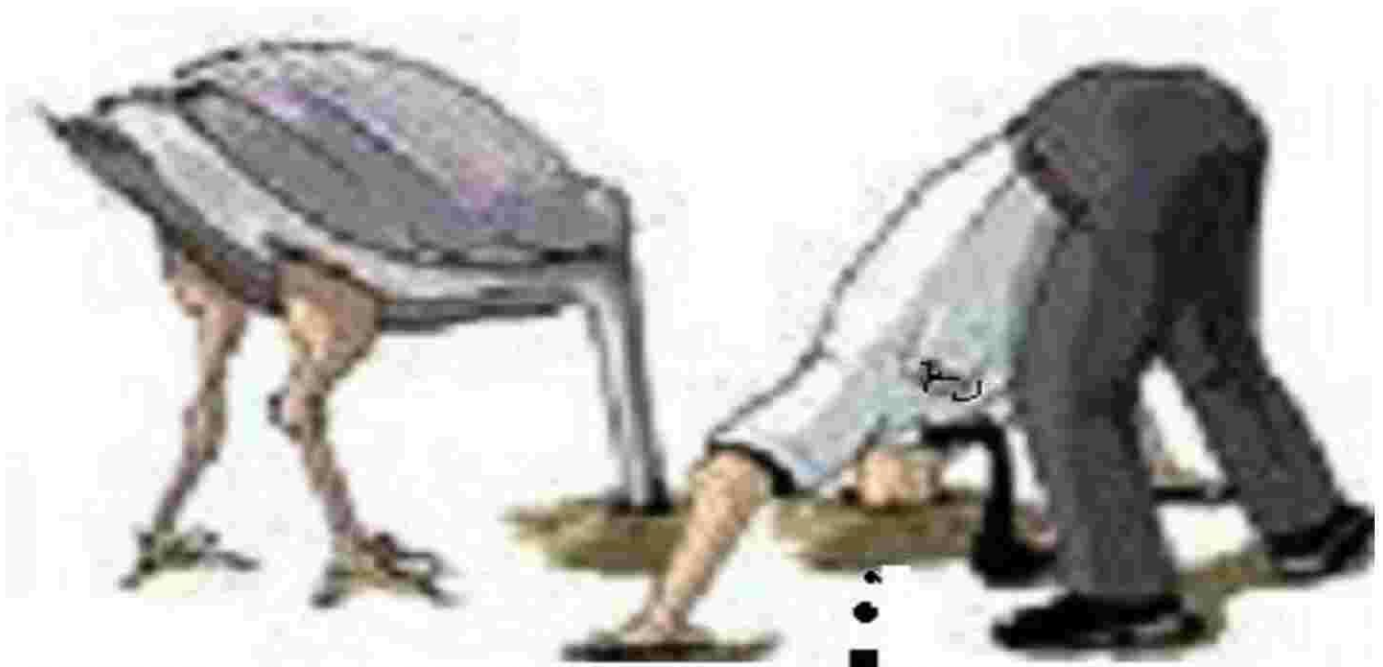
State of Kansas going Broke?
